MINUTES

Call to Order- Invocation, Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Dennis Green called the meeting to order at 6:00PM. Mayor Pro-tem Hartman led all in the invocation, followed by City Council leading in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Members Present: Mayor Dennis Green, Mayor Pro-tem Donna Hartman, Shawn Knuckles, Robbie Johnson, Bruce Leonhardt.

City Staff: City Manager Dalton Rice, City Attorney Neale Potts, City Secretary Ophelia Rodriguez, Police Chief Charles Cline, Fire Chief Taran Williams

Announcements/ Citizens Public Comments

Citizen Larry Hartman- Asked if Council would consider reinstating the Texas flag pledge back into the City Council meetings and asked there were any updates with a past discussion regarding the management of the City's only intersection due to the school traffic flow.

Citizen Jimanne Durkee- the city survey was complete and ready for mailing. She thanked all those that volunteered to fold and stuff envelopes for several hours.

Item 1 Discuss and take appropriate action- Sarah Wood – Library report on Summer Reading Program
Miss Wood gave the report on the summer Reading program. She was head of the program which consisted of 40 students with an attendance of 15 to 17 students each session. Sarah was recognized, presented with a gift and a letter of recognition by Mayor Dennis Green for her hard work and dedication to the City Library.

Item 2 Discuss and take appropriate action- Citizen of the Year 2020-2021
Mayor Dennis Green announced Jimanne Durkee as Citizen of the Year. Mrs. Durkee was recognized for her continual commitment to her community for so many years and long overdue. Jimanne's volunteerism with the success of the Library Summer Reading programs, maintaining the City's website, working with the City Manager's Coffee meetings with the public, other functions too many to list, shows her epitomizing leadership in our community.

Item 3 Discuss and take appropriate action- Minutes, July 13, 2021, August 3, 2021, August 10, 2021
Mayor Dennis Green entertained a motion. Mayor Pro-tem Hartman made the motion to approve the 3 sets of minutes as written. Council member Shawn Knuckles made the second motion. All present voted 'Aye'. Motion carried.

Item 4 Discuss and take appropriate action - PUBLIC HEARING- Proposed Tax Rate for the 2021 tax year (FY2022)

Mayor Dennis Green opened the floor to the public for comments regarding the Tax Rate at 6:15PM. With no comments from the floor, Mayor Green closed the floor at 6:16 PM.

Item 5 Discuss and take appropriate action -Vote on proposed Tax Rate for the 2021 tax year (FY2022)/ Ordinance 2021-06

Mayor Green entertained a motion. Mayor Pro-tem Hartman made the motion to adopt Ordinance 2021-06 regarding the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of 61.92 per 1000, which is effectively a 13.22% percent increase in the tax. Mayor Pro-tem Hartman explained how the tax rate would impact citizens. A \$100K home would be \$23.40, \$200K home would be \$46.80, \$300K home would be \$70.20, \$400K home would be \$93.60. She reminded citizens of "Maintenance Fees" that were dissolved by Council. Mayor Pro-tem recognized Mr. Cary Erskine the city's finance director for his clear, easy to understand financial reports and charts. Council member Bruce Leonhardt made the second motion. All present voted "Aye". Motion carried.

Item 6 Discuss and take appropriate action- Resolution 2021-17 Budget Amendments (FY 2020/2021)

City Manager Rice advised with the 3 weeks left before fiscal year's budget, the opportunity is available to purchase 2 much needed items. License plate cameras, that would collect traffic data within the city especially with the current school traffic flow. They are also capable to collect information on vehicles that are stolen. Also needed is a Server for all programs to include City's finance and payroll software. Mayor Green entertained a motion. Council member Robbie Johnson made the motion to accept Resolution 2021-17. Council member Shawn Knuckles made the second motion. All present voted "Aye". Motion carried.

Item 7 Discuss and take appropriate action- Accessory Building Request- Update since July 13, 2021

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MORGAN'S POINT RESORT, TEXAS, CONTAINING FINDINGS OF FACT; AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE A DEFINITION OF A GOLF CART; REGULATING THE USE OF GOLF CARTS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS; DEFINING REQUIRED EQUIPMENT FOR GOLF CARTS; DETERMINING WHO MAY OPERATE A GOLF CART WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS; AND PROVIDING AN OFFENSE AND A PENALTY OF UP TO \$500.00 FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR EXCEPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT.

Whereas Chapter 551 of the Texas Transportation Code authorizes cities regulate the use of Golf Carts within the city limits; and

Whereas this ordinance promotes the public health, safety, and welfare and helps alleviate traffic hazards;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORGAN'S POINT RESORT, TEXAS:

That Chapter 12 of the City Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to add the following Sections 12.05.001 through 12.05.006.

Section 12.05.001 Definitions

A Golf Cart has the meaning assigned by the Texas Transportation Code Section 551.401. which states a "golf cart means a motor vehicle designed by the manufacturer primarily for use on a golf course." Golf carts specifically exclude go-carts, neighborhood electric vehicles, off road vehicles, utility vehicles, and all-terrain vehicles, as defined by the Texas Transportation Code

Section 12.05.002. Golf Cart Use within the corporate boundaries of Morgan's Point Resort

Golf carts may be operated during daylight hours within the corporate city limits of Morgan's Point Resort on streets with a posted speed limit of not more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour.

Section 12.05.003 Use prohibited on any state highway within corporate boundaries of Morgan's Point Resort

Golf carts are prohibited on any state highway located within the corporate boundaries of the city to include: FM 2483 and FM 2271 (Morgan's Point Road).

Section 12.05.004. Equipment required

A golf cart must have the following equipment to operate within the corporate city limits:

- (1) Headlamps
- (2) Tail lamps
- (3) Reflectors
- (4) Parking brake
- (5) Mirrors
- (6) Horn
- (7) Slow moving vehicle placard

Section 12.05.005. Exclusions and Limitations.

The following exclusions and limitations apply to the operation of any golf cart in the City of Morgan's Point Resort:

- (1) Golf carts may only be operated by persons with a valid operator's permit and/or driver's license.
- (2) Golf carts may only be operated upon a public street or highway with a speed limit of not more than 35 mph unless otherwise restricted.
- (3) Golf carts must have a license plate as required by State law.
- (4) A golf cart may cross street or highway with a speed limit of more than 35 mph if said crossing occurs at an intersection and said crossing is perpendicular to the street or highway with a posted speed limit of more than 35 mph. Golf carts may only cross a street or highway with a speed limit of 45 mph or greater at an intersection with a traffic signal or sign.
- (5) Golf carts must move to the right and yield the right of way to faster moving vehicles.
- (6) The driver and every occupant of a golf cart must remain seated in a seat designed to hold passengers, while the golf cart is in motion.
- (7) No person may ride in the lap of the driver or any other occupant.
- (8) Golf carts must comply with applicable Texas and City of Morgan's Point Resort traffic laws.
- (9) The driver of a golf cart may not operate in such a manner as to endanger any person or property; or to obstruct, hinder or impede the lawful court of travel of any motor vehicle or the lawful use of any pedestrian or public streets, sidewalks, paths, trails, walkway, or parks.

Section 12.05.006 . Penalty

Any person, firm, entity or corporation who violates any provision of this article, as it exists or may be amended, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00). Each continuing day's violation under this article shall constitute a separate offense. The penal provisions imposed under this article shall not preclude the city from filing suit to enjoin the violation. Morgan's Point Resort retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state, and federal law.

To the extent of any conflict between the terms of this ordinance and any prior ordinance, this ordinance shall govern and control.

If any part or provision of this ordinance or application thereof, to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of the ordinance are severable.

The Ordinance shall be effective immediately following its publication in the local newspaper as required by the Texas Local Government Code. Thereafter, the rules contained therein will apply within the City of Morgan's Point Resort, Texas.

Honorable Mayor and Council,

- 1. The department responded to 78 calls last month. That represents a 39% increase over September of 2020 (N=56).**

Among those calls, the department responded to (2) structure fires, (6) vegetation fires and a large-scale Wildland/Urban Interface (WUI) incident that threatened multiple homes near Dana Peak.

- 2. Average Response Time for Priority 2 or higher calls was 10 minutes, 31 seconds (N=62). This does represent the highest response time for the year-to-date, but upon further evaluation, a number of responses of this acuity occurred deeper into our county and mutual aid territories than normal. For example, (2) responses were made to a Priority 1 incident by our Wildfire Division to the Dana Peak Fire at (26) minutes.**

- 3. A total of 1531 were worked on station throughout the month:**

a. Career Staff (3)-	591 Hours	39%
b. Volunteer Staff (20)-	764 Hours	50%
c. Relief Driver (5)-	174 Hours	11%

- 4. Active Roster- Eighteen members met or exceeded the requirements for Active Service Units in August. The names of inactive members are not published due to privacy concerns as situations vary.**
- 5. Dana Peak Wildfire- The following is a detailed account of a 76-acre WUI Alarm our Wildfire Division was deployed to near Stillhouse Lake. The conditions our Firefighters encountered were very similar to what they would experience in the event of another WUI in our community, as with the Oakmont Fire back in 2017. The Texas Forest Service has advised our region to prepare for an extended and more treacherous winter wildfire season this year due to unusual weather patterns. We were happy to be a part of saving countless homes at this WUI event, but further recognize the threat we face in our district and the training opportunity this response afforded our Wildland Team. Members of our Command Staff will be attending an After-Action Review on Friday, October 15th at the Harker Heights Fire Department.**

On Sunday, September 26, Morgan's Point Resort Brush 62 and Battalion 61 responded to assist with a wildfire in Dana Peak Park on Stillhouse Lake near Harker Heights. The initial response included a Fire Captain, two Firefighters and a Chief Officer. The units arrived to find Firefighters from Harker Heights, Killeen, Copperas Cove, Central Bell and Southwest Bell making a coordinated attack alongside the Texas A&M Forest Service. Dozer crews were helping contain the fire by removing vegetation between the fire and residential subdivision on the other side of Comanche Gap Road. Battalion 61 requested the Belton Fire Corps through the Bell County Communications Center to assist with rehab, and Brush 62 was assigned a standby along Comanche Gap in the event the fire jumped the roadway. Headway was being made on the fire and Battalion 61 returned to the City.

While most structure fires are influenced mainly by presence of fuel and oxygen, wildfires are further influenced by weather conditions. Such was the case yesterday when, shortly after 3.30 PM, a change in wind directly carried embers across the roadway, igniting several "spot fires" in vegetation that led uphill and directly towards dozens of occupied homes.

MPR Fire was activated as part of the Eastside Strike Team at 3.38 PM to provide additional manpower and equipment. Battalion 61 returned to Dana Peak, joined by Engine 61, Brush 61 and a utility unit. Crews arrived to find a fast-moving fire with flame lengths exceeding 30 feet and spreading across the tree tops.

Brush 61 joined in the active firefight alongside Brush 62. Battalion and Engine 61 served under the Structure Protection Division, securing a hydrant water supply and plumbing an entire city block with fire hose to meet the oncoming fire front. Firefighters from Engine 61 prepped exposed structures by removing combustibles from decks and patios, sealing doors and windows and applying water to the home and surrounding yards.

A Travis County STAR Flight helicopter made numerous water drops on the fire and was instrumental in keeping it at bay. Dozers from the Forest Service continued to work the fire line, as did hand crews from Morgan's Point Resort and other Bell County agencies. The Bell County Fire Marshal's Office responded, providing support at the County level. Other departments on scene included: Moffat, Bartlett, Salado, Belton, Temple, Holland, Sparta and Little River. Law enforcement from Harker Heights and several other agencies assisted in traffic control and preparing for an evacuation.

Through the joint and concerted effort of each agency named, the fire was brought under control and contained without losing a single structure or life. No injuries were reported by MPR Fire personnel. Crews returned to the station just after 8 PM and spent several hours cleaning equipment and repacking hose.

We extend our thanks to everyone involved, especially to our 8 volunteer members who gave over 60 hours combined time yesterday, the volunteers of the Belton Fire Corps who provided a steady supply of food and refreshment to weary Firefighters. We also wish to thank the Sparta Volunteer Fire Department and Temple Fire & Rescue for providing coverage to our community that allowed us to send a few of our best trained wildland firefighters and specialized equipment to where those resources could have a positive impact.

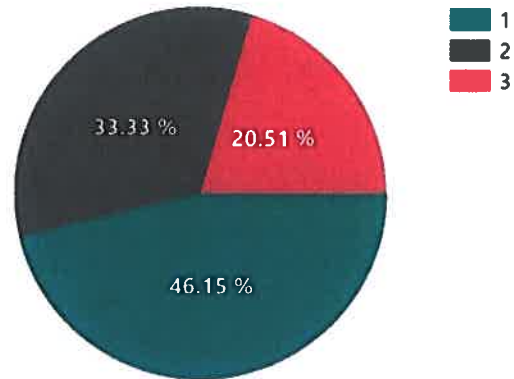

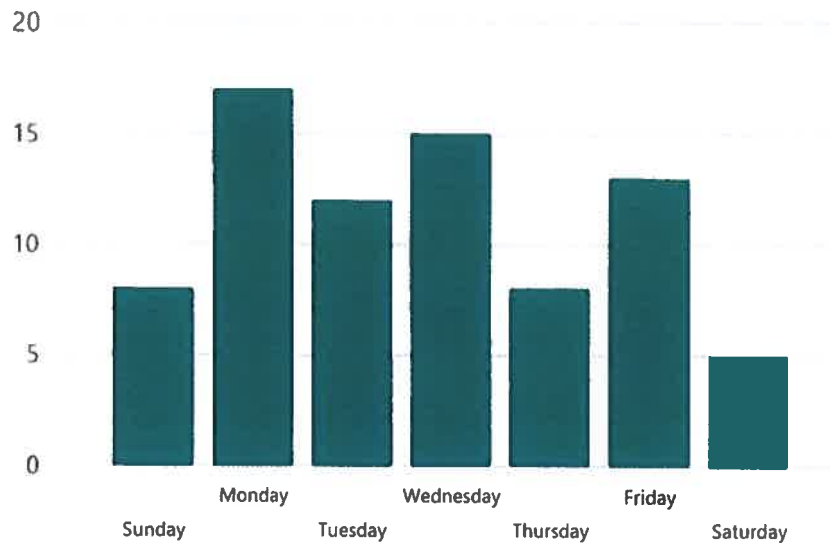

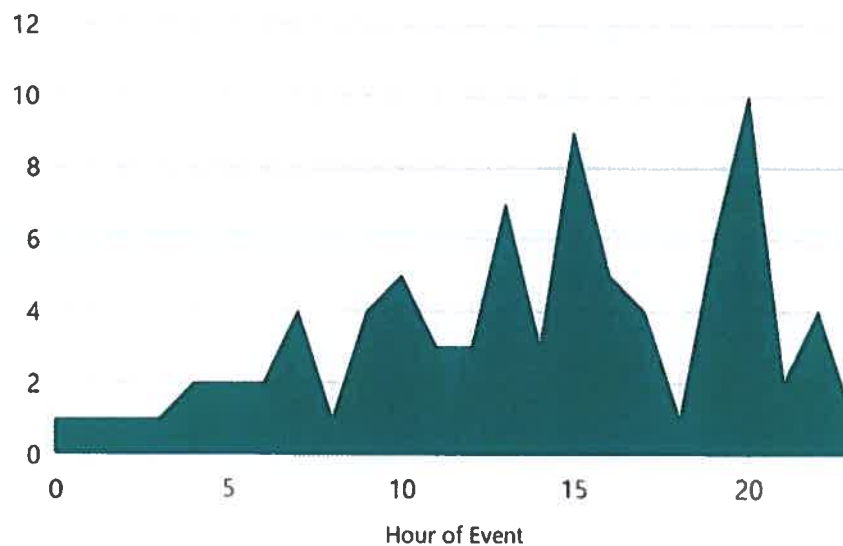
Previous Month
